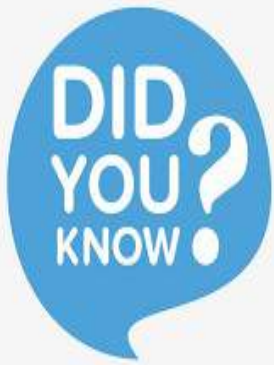

- Is spelled phonetically like Maltese.



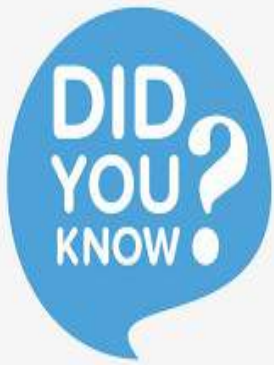

 - Germany is a top destination!

It had **more** visitors than France or the United Kingdom.

Only Spain had more visitors than Germany.



- Even for Maltese tourists, Germany ranks on third place, after the UK and Italy.

There are many reasons for that!



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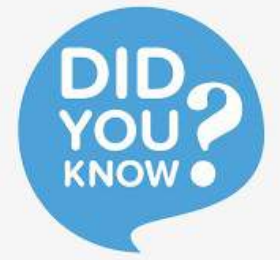

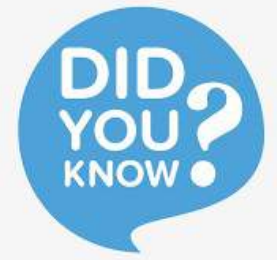
- The majority of German speaking countries are Germany, Austria and Switzerland.

(*"Dach"* means *"roof"* in German)



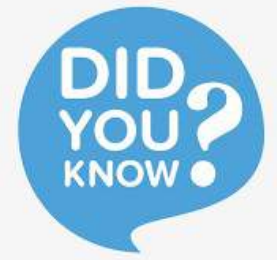
Did you know?



- German has the biggest number of native speakers in Europe – around 100 millions.



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Worldwide there are 130 million speakers of German as a mother tongue.



1.1 The Alps

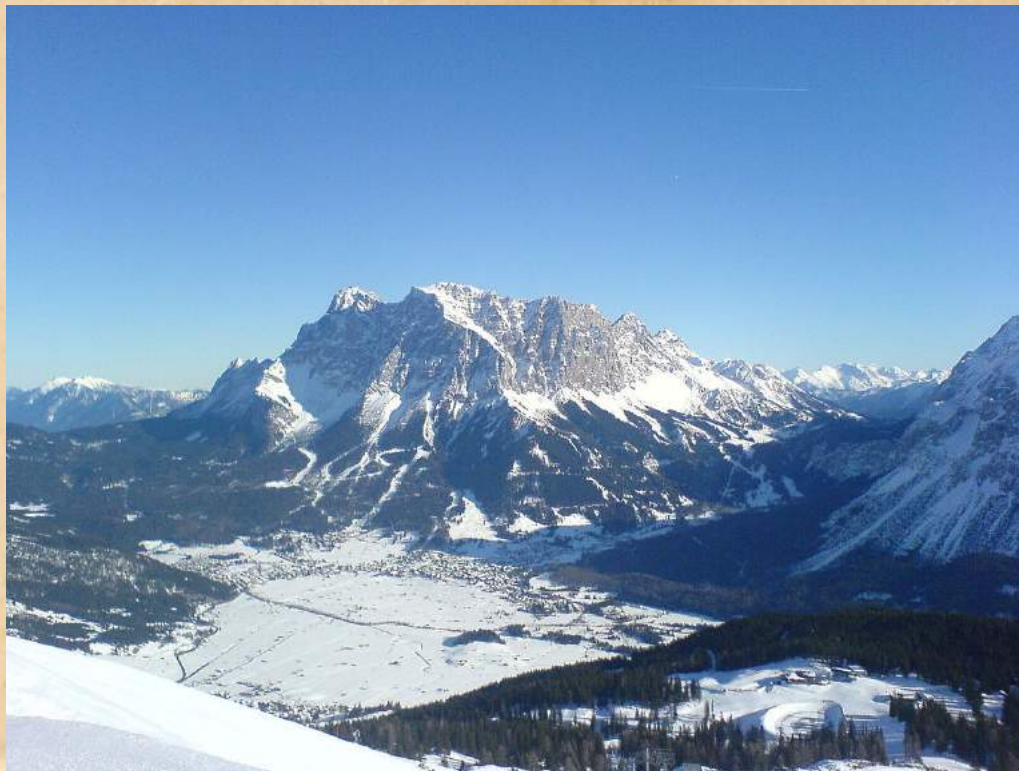


1.1 The Alps: getting on top of them



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Highest peak: the *Zugspitze* (“windy peak”), it is 2,963 metres high.

Very important for transporting goods, but also for tourism and wine

1.3 The Black Forest

- A third of Germany is still covered in forests.

- A **third** of Germany is still covered in forests.
- The biggest one is the *Black Forest, der Schwarzwald*.

Berlin has around 180 museums. Most famous one is the Pergamon-Museum.



2.2 Cologne

- Home to the *Cologne Cathedral*, built between 1248 – 1880. It is the third tallest church of the world.



2.2 Cologne: the *Carnival*

- It is the second largest in the world, after Rio de Janeiro (Brasil).

- The world's largest beer festival and travelling funfair.

There are over 25 000 castles in Germany.

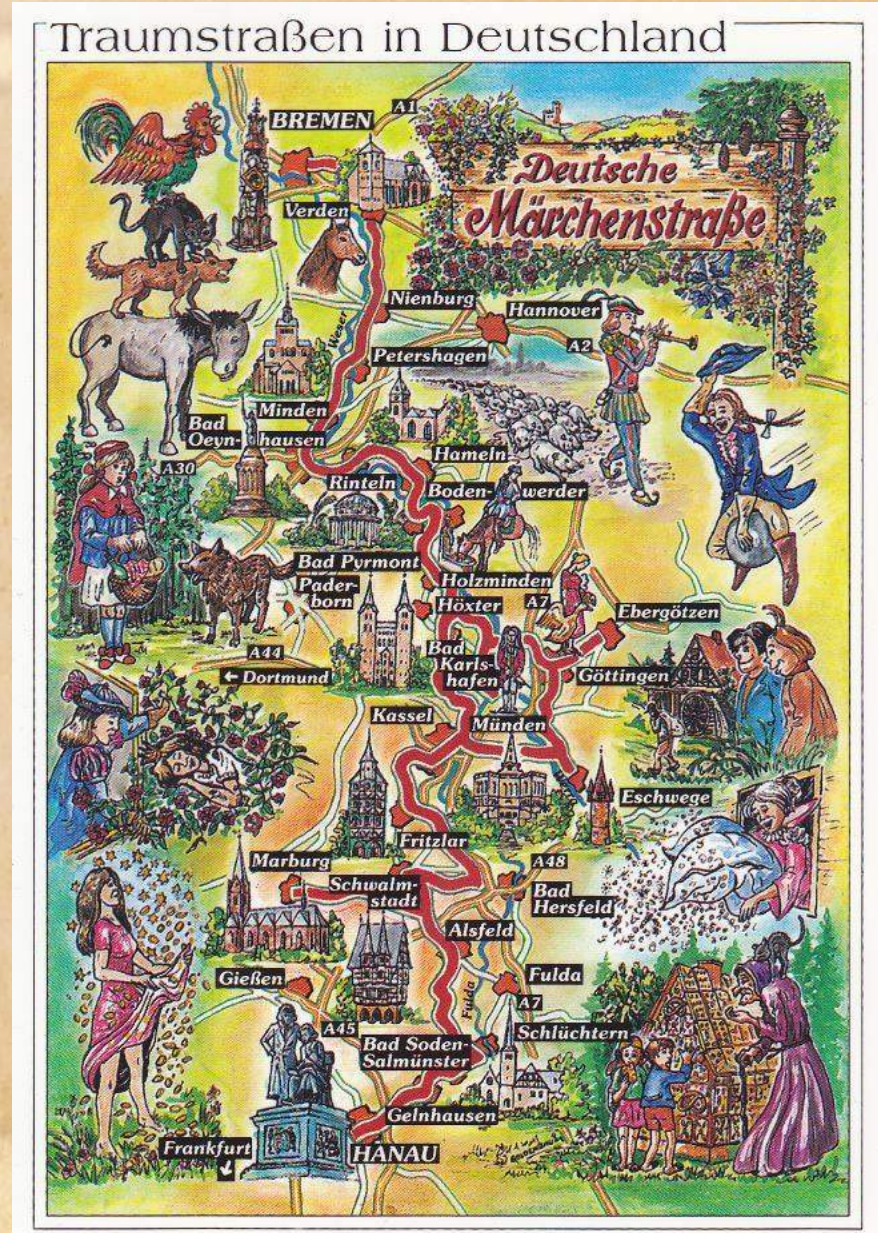

Many of them still inhabited by noble families.



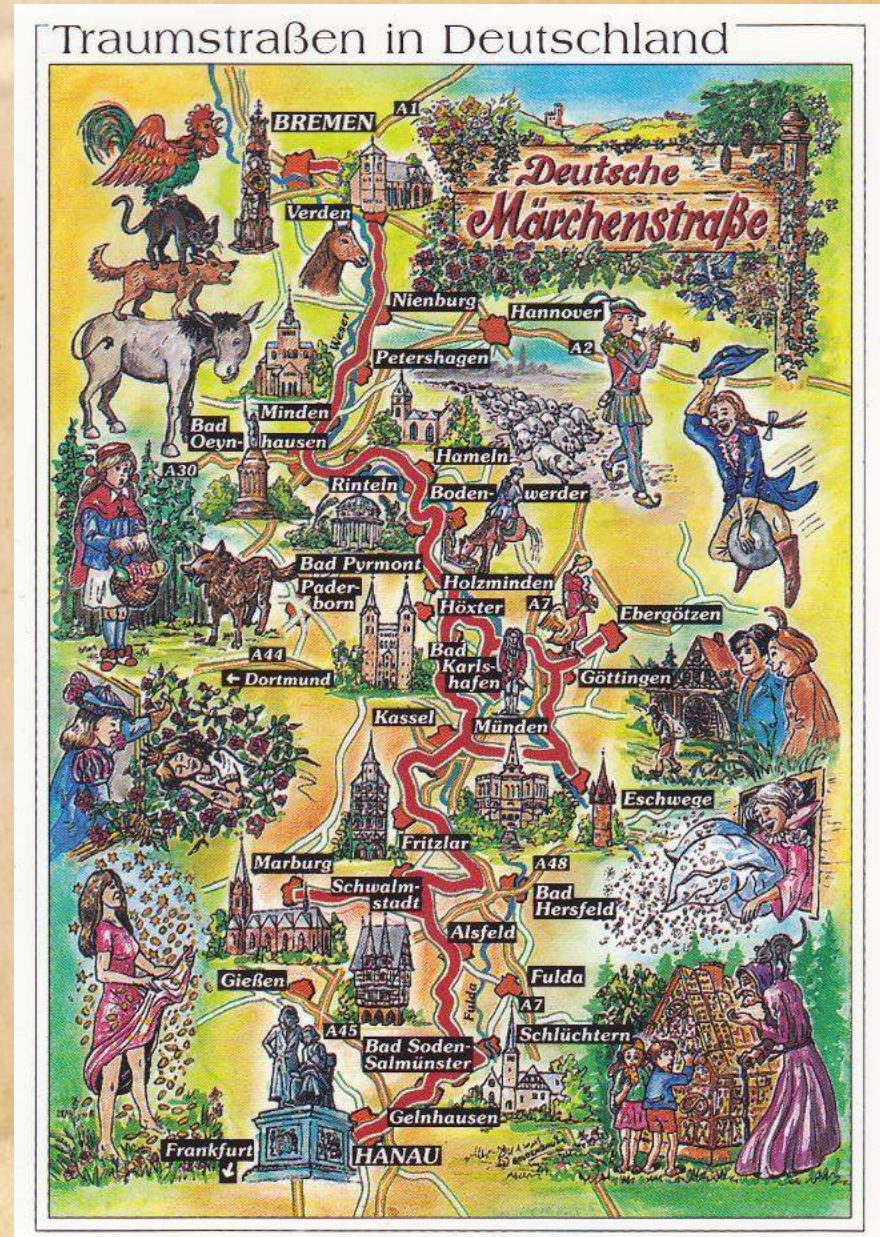
4. Castles and fairy tales: The Fairy Tale Route

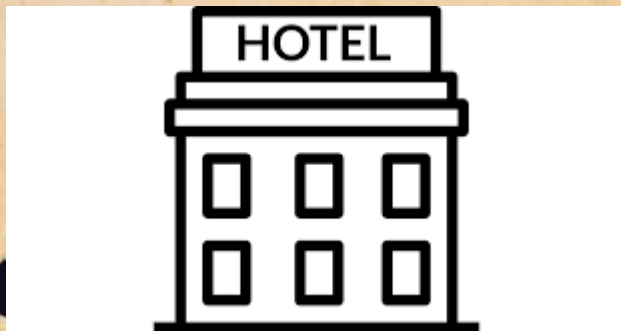

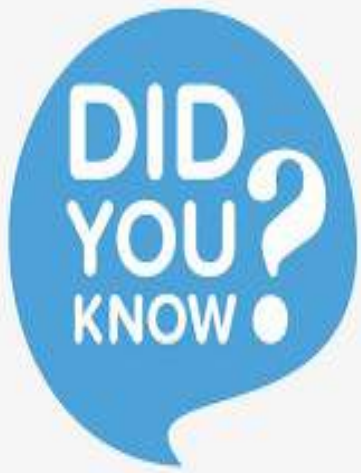

3.3 Interpreter



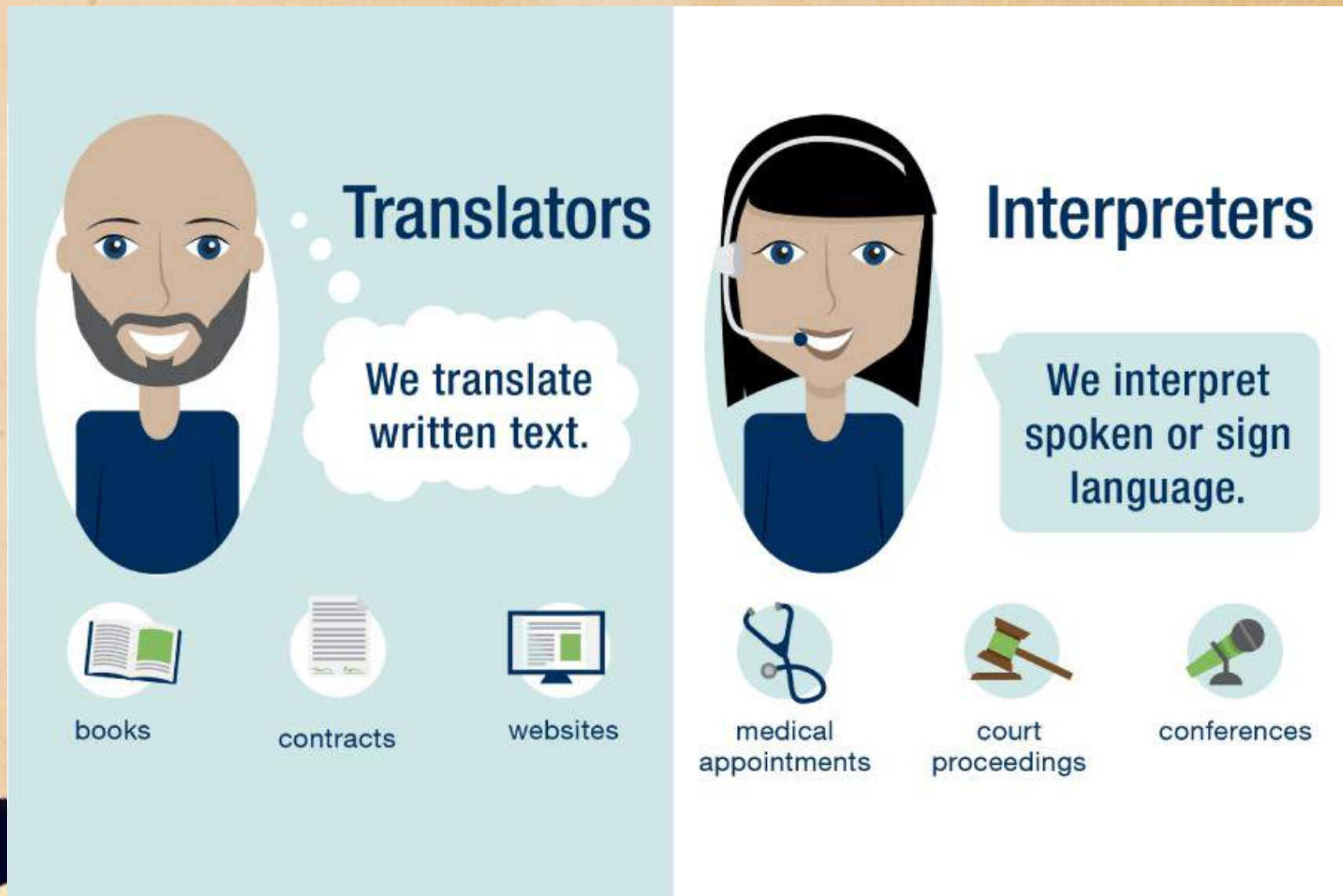
3. Interpreter
